Mr. Wooten noted there were a few changes from last work session and he needed the Commissioners' consensus on how to move forward:

(a) Appalachian Women's Museum requested \$15,000

<u>Consensus</u>: Grant an allocation of \$10,000, which could go towards stabilizing the porch area.

(b) Community Table requested an increase of \$5,000 for a total of \$20,000.

Consensus: Grant an allocation of \$15,000.

(c) CURVE requested an increase from \$3,700 to \$5,000.

Consensus: Grant an allocation of \$5,000.

(d) Historical Society requested an increase from \$5,000 to \$8,000.

Consensus: Do not fund at this time.

(e) Circles of Hope requested \$5,000.

<u>Consensus</u>: Grant an allocation of \$1,500. Mr. Wooten to ask them to provide more statistics.

(f) Tuckasegee Substation – CDC. The Cullowhee Fire Department has requested \$10,000 to match funds they had already spent. These funds would allow them to address restrooms and accessibility. Their goal was to try and get voting back in that building and the building potentially has the opportunity to provide a community center for the Tuckasegee area.

Consensus: Grant an allocation of \$10,000.

(g) Municipality Grant Program. This was a past program where municipalities could complete a grant application requesting funds from the county for projects, for a maximum of \$5,000.

Consensus: Restore the program without earmarking funds.

(4) **PUBLIC SCHOOLS**: Mr. Wooten presented:

Current expense as requested and \$75,000 increase for deferred maintenance.

Consensus: Fund the request as submitted.

(5) **SOUTHWESTERN COMMUNITY COLLEGE**: Mr. Wooten presented:

Current expenses and capital as requested. New maintenance building and renovations to Summit included in capital improvements plan.

Consensus: Fund the request as submitted.

(6) <u>CASHIERS PROPERTY</u>: Mr. Wooten stated that a request had been made for the county to consider participating in a parking lot project in Cashiers. There was a piece of property on Highway 64 that was on the market that used to be the Bond Builders Supply property. There was a lack of centralized parking in Cashiers and they would like to create parking that could be used by the public. They would like the county to partner with other non-profits to acquire the 4 acre parcel. The property cost was in the range of \$1 mil, more or less. Developing the property into a parking facility would possibly be another \$1 mil. The county would need to put down \$40,000-\$50,000 hard money to move forward and obtain an extension on the option.

Consensus: Do not move forward with the request.

(7) <u>CALENDAR CHANGE</u>: Chairman McMahan requested that the June work session be moved from June 21st to June 14th.

There being no further business, Commissioner Deitz moved to adjourn the meeting. Commissioner Elders seconded the Motion. Motion carried and the meeting adjourned at 5:06 p.m.
