Background

Local jails are one of the first points of contact for all individuals who become involved with the criminal justice system and represent a unique opportunity to identify those in need of treatment. The purpose of this project is to conduct comprehensive behavioral health and substance use assessments of individuals booked into Jackson and Transylvania county jails in order to develop a system-wide coordinated approach to safely reduce the prevalence of low risk individuals with mental illness, substance use disorders, and co-occurring mental illness-substance use disorders in local jails.

Objectives

- Collect and analyze comprehensive behavioral health data from adults booked into the two jails
- Examine the prevalence rates of the various behavioral health conditions observed among jail detainees
- Provide Interactive Journals (an intervention shown to reduce recidivism) to those who meet positive criteria for OUD, other SUDs, MI, and CMISA
- Conduct analyses of prospective recidivism rates and their association with prognostic information, offense type, offense severity, and connections to services
- Generate final reports for County Commissioners and Sheriffs
